Examples of Abuse—Physical Neglect as a Form of Abuse

We have looked at a definition of abuse, possible physical and behavioral indicators of physical abuse and now we turn to a different type of abuse: Physical Neglect. The NCC handbook on abuse prevention states: “Neglect is the negligent treatment or maltreatment of a child by a parent or caretaker under circumstances indicating harm or threatened physical harm to the child’s health or welfare. California Law defines two forms of neglect: severe neglect and general neglect.

- **Severe neglect** means the negligent failure of a parent or caretaker to protect the child from severe malnutrition or a medically diagnosed non-organic failure to thrive. It also includes situations in which the parent or caretaker willfully cause or permits the body or health of the child to be endangered. This includes the intentional failure to provide adequate food, clothing, shelter, or medical care.
- **General neglect** means the negligent failure of a parent or caretaker to provide adequate food, clothing, shelter, medical care or supervision where no physical injury of the child has occurred.

As a church, we want to be a place where children feel safe, are provide for and that encouraged the education of parents and parishioners on this subject to reduce the abuse of this vulnerable segment of our church. Next week we will look at some indicators of physical neglect that we can be aware of.
